## FOR THE ATTENTION OF ALL PUBLIC FOOTPATH USERS

## Bath and North East Somerset Council are proposing to change the Public Rights of Way network in respect of Public Footpaths BA27/27 and BA27/28 at Hygge Park (Withies Farm) in the Parish of Keynsham

The general effect of the proposal is shown on the attached plan.

Public Footpath (FP) BA27/27 commencing from a point approx 17m from its junction with FP BA27/28 at grid reference ST 6656 6796 at point A on the plan continuing in a generally south easterly direction for approx 309m to ST 6683 6780 at point B would be stopped up, as shown on the plan by a bold red line. The new line of FP BA27/27 would commence from the same point continuing via points F, G and H for approx 352m to finish at point B, as shown on the plan by a bold green line.

FP BA27/28 commencing from ST 6656 6805 at point C on the plan continuing in a generally northerly direction via point D for approx 184m to a junction with Bath Road (local access) at ST 6653 6822 at point E would be stopped up, as shown on the plan by a bold red line. The new line of FP BA27/28 would commence from the same point continuing via point J for approx 178m to a junction with Bath Road (local access) at ST 6653 6822 at point K, as shown on the plan by a bold green line.

These changes are proposed to enable development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission 18/013087/RES and would be achieved by way of a diversion order made under section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990. The new footpaths will vary in width between 2 metres and 3.7 metres. Works will be carried out through the development process to bring the new paths to a condition fit for public use.
