BATH AND NORTH EAST SOMERSET COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATH BA27/27, WITHIES GREEN, KEYNSHAM) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2025

The above order was made on 27 February 2025. The effect of the order will be to divert the public footpath running from grid reference ST 6683 6780 and continuing in a generally east-southeasterly direction for approximately 171 metres to grid reference ST 6698 6774, to a line running from grid reference ST 6683 6780 and proceeding in a generally east south-easterly direction for approximately 80 metres to grid reference ST 6690 6776, and then turning in a generally north north-easterly direction for approximately 8 metres to grid reference ST 6690 6777, and then turning in a generally east south-easterly direction for approximately 73 metres to grid reference ST 6696 6773, and then turning in a generally north north-easterly direction for approximately 14 metres to grid reference ST 6697 6774, and then turning in a generally east south-easterly direction for approximately 19 metres to grid reference ST 6698 6774, as shown on the order map.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Bath and North East Somerset Council may itself confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
