4. <u>REASONS FOR THE CREATION/DIVERSION/EXTINGUISHMENT * OF</u> <u>THE PATH</u>

To provide a better right of way across the existing track network just 20 meters adjacent, which offers a better surface, flatter and wider width for walkers. This also then allows the current field to be utilised for all agricultural and recreational purposes, where at present it cannot as the path cuts directly across it.

e) What works do you propose to undertake to bring the new path into a condition fit for use by the public?

A small stretch of new fencing 3m wide will help define the route from the existing route, down to the new route along the track, by cutting of the corner of the existing field to make the new route more gradual, with a hardstanding surface, of some 45m.

- d) Gradients A slight gradient will be introduced to meet the existing track network away from the field, however this will be reduced to as small a gradient as possible by angling the new route and cutting off the corner of the existing field to accommodate. The new route provides a much flatter more stable surface overall than the existing uneven, arable field, which far out ways this small adjustment.
- e) **Maintenance** No effect. The new route will be maintained inline with any and all requirements
- Safety The new route is much safer for walkers as it provides a wider, more stable, flatter surface for walking
