- The public footpath commencing from grid reference ST 6073 5762 and proceeding in a generally east north-easterly direction for approximately 222 metres to grid reference ST 6095 5067 and continuing in a generally east northeasterly direction for approximately 67 metres to grid reference ST 6100 5771, to a new line commencing from grid reference ST 6073 5762 and proceeding in a generally north-easterly direction for approximately 239 metres to grid reference ST 6095 5770 and continuing in a generally east north-easterly direction for approximately 51 metres to grid reference ST 6100 5771; and
- 2. The public footpath commencing from grid reference ST 6114 5753 and proceeding in a generally northerly direction for approximately 141 metres to grid reference ST 6113 5767 and continuing in a generally north north-easterly direction for approximately 96 metres to grid reference ST 6116 5776, to a new line commencing from grid reference ST 6114 5753 and proceeding in a generally north north-easterly direction for approximately 158 metres to grid reference ST 6117 5769 and continuing in a generally northerly direction for approximately 75 metres to grid reference ST 6116 5776,

as shown on the order map.
