## **BATH AND NORTH EAST SOMERSET COUNCIL**

### **BATH AND NORTH EAST SOMERSET COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATH CL8/1, CHURCH LANE, EAST HARPTREE) TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2025**

Bath and North East Somerset Council ("the Council") being the highway authority for Public Footpath CL8/1 in the County and District of Bath and North East Somerset is satisfied that pedestrian traffic in the said public footpath should be restricted because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the footpath to facilitate electrical works on behalf of National Grid.

The Council in exercise of its powers under section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following order:

1. No person shall proceed in that length of Public Footpath CL8/1 commencing from grid reference ST 5655 5600 (point A on the Order Plan) and proceeding in a generally east-southeasterly direction for approximately 37 metres to a junction with Church Lane at grid reference ST 5657 5598 (point B on the Order Plan).
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this order shall apply to any contractor necessarily proceeding to or from the said works.
3. This order shall come into operation on 1st September 2025 and will be operative until 6th October 2025. The Order may be cited as the Bath and North East Somerset (Public Footpath CL8/1, Church Lane, East Harptree) Temporary Traffic Regulation Order 2025.
