BATH AND NORTH EAST SOMERSET COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATH BA19/7, CARLINGCOTT, PEASEDOWN ST JOHN) TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2021

Bath and North East Somerset Council ("the Council") being the highway authority for in the County and District of Bath and North East Somerset is satisfied that pedestrian traffic over the said footpath should be restricted because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near the right of way by Bristol Water to renew 500 metres of water main.

The Council in exercise of its powers under section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following order:

- 1. No person shall proceed over that length of Public Footpath BA19/7 commencing from the northeast end of public footpath BA4/47 at grid reference ST 6912 5797 (point A on the Order Plan) and proceeding generally in a northeasterly direction for approximately 352 metres to the junction with Carlingcott at grid reference ST 6942 5815 (point B on the Order Plan).
- 2. Nothing in Article 1 of this order shall apply to any contractor necessarily proceeding to or from the said works.
- 3. This order shall come into operation on 9th August 2021 and will be operative for a period of 10 weeks. The Order may be cited as the Bath and North East Somerset Council (Public Footpath BA19/7, Carlingcott, Peasedown St John) Temporary Traffic Regulation Order 2021.


